Edward C. Feeney, 94, of Toledo, passed away Saturday, August 6, 2011, at Hospice of Northwest Ohio, in Toledo. He was born January 13, 1917, in Toledo, to Christopher and Christina Feeney. Edward served honorably in WW II as a Tech Sgt. in the Army, first in the cavalry and then as a surgical technician. He fought in the Battle of the Bulge and was awarded the Bronze Star and the Purple Heart. Ed worked for the Post Office for 30 years as a carrier, supervisor and superintendent, before retiring. He then went to work at Owens-Illinois, where he was instrumental in getting them their own zip code and designing their mail room. Ed retired after 10 years. He was a former member of Blessed Sacrament Church and presently was a member of St. Pius X Church. Other memberships include the Knights of Columbus, American Legion, Conn Weissenberger Post, N.A.L.C., GAF, Turners and Mennachor. Survivors include his wife of 67 years, Margaret Feeney; son, Kevin (Robin) Feeney; daughters, Sue Lindsey, Molly Feeney and Laurie (Joe) Weiher; grandchildren, Christopher Lindsey and Emily Lindsey, Michael Weiher, Casey (Stephanie) Weiher and Megan (Pete) Zapadka and great-grandchildren, Ty and Quin Zapadka. Ed was preceded in death by his son-in-law, Kemp Lindsey and brother, John Feeney. Friends are invited to visit from 3-8 p.m. Tuesday, in the Ansberg-West Funeral Home, 3000 Sylvania Avenue.
