She won numerous sales awards and trips which she enjoyed with her husband Ray during their marriage of 57 years. On one such trip, she attended a sales presentation for a time share vacation home. At the end of the meeting she accepted her gift, and proceeded to sell a set of encyclopedias to the professional presenter. She was a woman ahead of her times in the sales profession.
