I didn't talk to Ian enough in my lifetime, but the times we talked were always meaningful and memorable. The last meaningful time we spoke was around Christmas time when my wife and I had a post nuptial party for friends and family, and we were both pleasantly surprised to see Ian there that night. A lot of people congratulated me on getting married that night, but Ian's words stuck with me more than almost anyone I talked to.
