Marcy Andrews, age 68, died peacefully in her sleep on September 23, 2016. She was born on October 12, 1947 in Toledo, Ohio to Jerome (Harry) and Ann (Borowiak) Siwajek. Marcy graduated from Central Catholic High School in 1965 and went to work at Union Local 1076. She married Harley J. Andrews on December 7, 1973 beginning their own personal war. They celebrated nearly 43 years together until her passing. After raising her daughter, Vanessa, she worked for the Lucas County Office of Education for 9 years, spending 22 years of her career at the Oregon Branch of the Toledo Lucas County Public Library. Marcy always went the extra mile for her patrons by ordering books, CDs and movies for them because she knew their preferences in reading and listening. She was dearly loved by her co-workers and her patrons from whom she received many gifts over the years as they appreciated so much the personal attention she provided.
