September 3, 1924 - May 27, 2013

Maurice Buckley age 88 years old died suddenly in his home on Monday May 27, 2013. Known as "Mossy" to family and friends, he was born on September 3, 1924 in Mallow, County Cork, Ireland to John and Ellen (Dinan) Buckley. Prior to immigrating to the United States in 1949 he was employed at the Mallow Sugar Factory. He arrived in Toledo 64 years ago. He retired and had been employed at the Gulf Oil Refinery for 32 years and subsequently employed with the Ohio Department of Transportation for 6 years. He was a member the Oil, Chemical and Atomic Workers Union. He also was a faithful Election Day poll worker having worked all the elections including the most recent. He was also active in the Lucas County Democratic Party. Mossy was a member of the Ancient Order of Hibernians, a past officer of the Knights of Equity Court No. 8, and the Irish Benevolent Club. He was a member of the Chevron/Gulf Retirees Spindle Top Club, as well as member of the Historic Church of St. Patrick and Christ the King Church. Mossy maintained his membership in the Pioneer Total Abstinence Association of Ireland through his life. Mossy enjoyed traveling annually to Ireland to visit family and friends, as well as traveling to Maryland and Florida. He loved to play golf, cards and dominoes, especially with his friends and grandchildren. As an avid reader and follower of current events, He was active and sharp to the very end. With a great love of sports he played hurling at home in Ireland and in the United States. He was an avid Notre Dame football fan and saw them play in Ireland in 1996 and the Stanford game last year. Mossy had a great sense of humor and loved to tell stories especially of his youth in Ireland. He was also the last of the Clock House Boys of Mallow. He would also share stories related to his employment at the Ohio Department of Transportation. He loved Irish music and culture. Mossy was preceded in death by his parents and his siblings Elizabeth, John, Dan and daughter-in-law Jennifer (Gorman) Buckley, and survived by his sister Mary (Buckley) Guinee of Mallow, Co. Cork, Ireland. He is also survived by his loving wife of 59 years, Mary Ann (McNulty), his children Kevin, Sean (Yvonne), Dan (Mary Ann), Brendan (Monica), Tom (Geri), Brian (Bronwen) and Maura, grandchildren Katie (Tim) Bettis, Megan, Ian (Elisa), Jacqueline, Bridget, Kaileigh Anne, Mary Anne, Shannon, Oona, and Stuart, great-grand child Eleanor and nieces and nephews in Ireland, England, Australia, Spain, and the United States.
