Steve P. Mihos, 85, of Toledo, passed away Wednesday, July 29, 2015. He was born, April 4, 1930, in Drepano, Greece and was the son of Panayotis and Ageliki Mihos. Steve worked on Aristotle Onassis ships, as a boiler operator. He married Evangelia Petros, on October 12, 1958 and their first son, Panyotis was born in 1960. In 1966 the family moved to Magna, Utah, where Steve took over a bar business from his aging uncle, George Zaros. Their second son, George was born in 1966. Steve retired from City Auto Stamping, as a boiler operator.

Steve enjoyed gardening, cooking, Bar-B-Que cooking and listening to Greek music. He also made his own homemade wine. The only time Steve saw his family in Greece, since he migrated to the United States, was in 1996. He always enjoyed cooking for any visitors who came to the house and treated them to a glass of his homemade wine. The last 3 years of his life, he developed dementia along with diabetes.

Steve was a member of Holy Trinity Greek Orthodox Cathedral, downtown Toledo and he volunteered numerous times at the Greek Festival.

He is survived by his wife, Evangelia Mihos; sons, Pete Mihos and George Mihos; grandchildren, Stephen and Marisa and niece, Tina. He was preceded in death by his brother, Christos; sisters, Eleni and Maria and his first grandson, Peter Mihos, age 14, in 1997, due to a tragic car accident.
