Albert J. Finch, 89, of Toledo, passed away Friday June 25, 2010, at Ebeid Hospice at Flower Hospital. He was born December 29, 1920, in Toledo and was the son of John and Mary Finch. Albert was a 1939 graduate of DeVilbiss High School. He served in the Navy during WWII, as an aviation radio man from 1942-45.
