



Anastasia "Ann" Mulopulos

February 7, 1928 - December 28, 2023

Anastasia "Ann" Mulopulos of Toledo, Ohio passed away peacefully in the Lord on December 28, 2023 at the age of 95. Ann was born in Pontiac, MI to Azarias and Sophia Savvas in 1928, who immigrated to Michigan as refugees from Semendria, Asia Minor. After graduating high school, she worked in Pontiac at the Public School Administration. Dedicated to the church from an early age, she became active in the founding of GOYA (Greek Orthodox Youth of America) in the early 1950s and traveled adventurously with her four girlfriends across the country, and even to Cuba, to attend conventions.

Her involvement with the church led her to the love of her life, her husband George, whom she met when they served together as co-chairs of a GOYA bowling tournament. They were inseparable. Ann and George married in 1960 and remained a team in everything they did, operating the State Café in downtown Toledo together for many years.

The church was her second home. She served as a humble and faithful servant throughout her life, including as a Sunday School Teacher, GOYA Advisor, and Choir member for many years. She served as President of Philoptochos, President of Daughters of Penelope, and founding member of Young At Heart. She was honored by the Metropolis of Detroit and Holy Trinity for her contributions to the church. In her later years she served as a volunteer on the Flower Hospital Ladies Auxiliary.

Ann was loved by everyone who knew her. Her selfless dedication to serving others made her a beloved friend and role model in her community. She could always be found making blankets for the needy or visiting shut-ins. Her kindness and generosity of spirit was felt by the many friends and family members she hosted in her home, which was always filled with joy and laughter.

She is survived by her son Peter (Sue Murt), her daughter Dorrie Papademetriou (Tom), and her beloved grandsons George and Roman Papademetriou. She is preceded in death by her parents, sister Evanthia and brother Savva.
