



Anastasios N Stathopoulos

February 19, 1919 - July 22, 2015

Anastasios N. Stathopoulos, 96, passed away on July 22, 2015 surrounded by his family in his home. He was born in Vlahokerasia, Arcadia Greece on February 19, 1919. He fought with the Greek army during World War II, stationed in the island of Crete when the Germans invaded in May of 1941. He served in the Greek army until December of 1947. He immigrated to the US in 1951 with his brothers Mike and Harry and settled in Pennsylvania. He later moved to Toledo when he married Chrisoula Maludy in 1954.. He worked in restaurants, as a meat cutter, delivery driver for Service Spot company, Findlay Sundry Sales and Vasko Company. In retirement he worked at Petros Market on Douglas Road. He was a faithful member of Holy Trinity Greek Orthodox Cathedral , and past president of the Order of AHEPA.

He is survived by his loving wife of 61 years, Chrisoula, daughters Maggie (Manuel) Steffas and Sophie, grandchildren, Maria, Nick and Tom Steffas, , sisters Ourania Pistolas and Vasiliki Mitchou of Greece and .special goddaughter, Toni Paterakis Wozniak and many nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his brothers, Dino, George, Demetris, Panayiotis, Mike and Harry, and sister Hariklia.
