



## Ann Davis Hamilton

Ann D. Hamilton passed away on November 26, 2015 at the Ebeid Hospice Residence in Sylvania, Ohio.

Ann was born in Getzville, New York on October, 13, 1935 as a child of Russel P. Davis and Lillian K, Davis. She attended Willimsville High School, Williamsville, New York, and graduated at the age of 16. She attended Wells College in Aurora, New York and graduated with a Liberal Arts Degree.
