



## Anna Bogedain-Sutter

July 7, 1927 - March 9, 2024

Anna Bogedain-Sutter (nee Georgieff), age 96, of Toledo, Ohio, passed away on March 9, 2024. Born in Jackson, Michigan, on July 7, 1927, she was the elder child of George Georgieff and Elizabeth Caputo (nee Morano).

After her father's passing, Anna moved numerous times, eventually settling in and calling Toledo, Ohio, home. In high school she began her life-long love of banking and started her career as a teller. Establishing herself as dedicated and knowledgeable, she eventually became one of the only female bank managers in the area and an assistant vice president of First Federal Savings and Loan Association. During her tenure, numerous awards and marks of recognition were presented in honor of her achievements. Following an exceptionally successful forty-year career, Anna retired to focus on spending more time with family and friends.

In addition to her banking career, Anna was a devoted wife and mother to her three children and five stepchildren whom she shared with Peter Bogedain. She also volunteered at the Toledo Children's Hospital for ten years and was very active in the Toledo Solos Club and the Eleanor Kahle Senior Citizens Center.

member of the solos dance group. She had a penchant for poker and gambling, often taking trips to Las Vegas with her girlfriends or family. Her adventures took her on many cruises, road trips, and boat rides throughout her life. She loved experiencing life to its fullest.
