She bought one when they first came out and then every couple years until her last one in 1983. One of her favorite stories to share was of she and her mother driving her '74 home in a snowstorm from Cleveland, when they were happened upon by a police officer, who was shocked to see two little old ladies driving such a sporty car. She always made people smile! Beverly retired from Owens-Illinois as a legal secretary for Mr. Boyd in the patent office. She loved her job there and was very proud of what

she was part of during her tenure. She traveled for work and pleasure, visiting all around the country, the Bahamas, and even Europe. She was especially fond of the Greenbriar Resort in West Virginia, and had myriad stories to share about who she saw there.
