January 14, 1916 - December 10, 2015

On Thursday, Dec 10th 2015, Charlotte “Wladzia” Jankowski was received into the arms of her loving savior, surrounded by her devoted family. She was 99 years old, 35 days short of her 100th birthday. Charlotte was born to Frank and Marcianna (Starwinski) Durniat in Toledo, Ohio, and a lifelong resident of the Polish Village and member of St. Adalbert’s Parish. As former president of the Catholic Mother’s Club, she started the “Queen for a Night” dance fundraiser.

She was employed by the City of Toledo for more than 20 years, in its Engineering Division, and was a member of the Lagrange Business and Professional Women’s Auxiliary. She loved to dance the polka and enjoyed music by Bobby Vinton. Charlotte had a true zest for life. She was extremely generous with a huge heart, and willing to help everyone. Charlotte had a cheerful disposition with a wonderful sense of humor. She loved playing pinochle. For 20 years, she participated in and hosted monthly pinochle card parties with three of her dearest friends. She was the greatest cook in the world. Her family favorites included meatballs, stuffing, soups and many other Polish comfort foods. As she was serving a meal, Charlotte was known to say, “Enjoy it with the best of health.” She used her culinary talents as head cook at Country Brook Assisted Living where she was employed for 12 years. She was preceded in death by her loving husband of 60 years, Raymond; brothers, Henry and Leo; and many lifelong friends who she cherished. She also loved her favorite lapdogs Rosie, Fluffy and CJ.
