Doris E. Bolbach, born Doris Elizabeth Evans, was a week away from reaching her 104th birthday on October 26. Doris is survived by her five children: Richard K. Bolbach, Dennis V. Bolbach, Barton G. Bolbach, Timothy J. Bolbach and Christina M. Kleman. She also was blessed with 14 Grandchildren, 29 Great-Grandchildren and 1 Great-Great-Grandchild.

Doris graduated from Waite High School in 1937 and attended Davis Business School. She met the love of her life, Richard G. Bolbach, at an ice-skating pond and was married in June of 1941. Doris became a homemaker for her husband and 5 children. During this period, she volunteered to be a Den Mother, she was a typist for her children's term papers, a dress maker, and a very creative artist. After the loss of her husband, she volunteered at St. Vincent Hospital.

Doris loved spending time with her Grandchildren and was always ready to help her family, from babysitting to taking care of family pets.
