Nagle Edwin J. Jr. Edwin J. Nagle Junior, 72 of Petersburg, MI passed away on October 23rd, 2011. As in life Ed was a comfort and friend until his final moments consoling and calming those around him with a beautiful smile and warm generous heart. Ed was born to Edwin J. Nagle Sr. and Bernadette R. (Jardine) Nagle on September 15th 1939. He attended Ladyfield Elementary school. At the age of fourteen Ed passed an FCC exam and became a licensed Ham radio operator one of the very few people that age to ever be granted a General Class License. He spent many warm youthful summers with his family and friends at Devil's Lake where he would eventually meet his loving wife Joanne (Bugyi) Nagle. Ed graduated from Central Catholic High school in 1957. In 1959 Ed began working for the Dana Corporation. Ed was married to Joanne (Bugyi) Nagle on August 26, 1961 and they recently celebrated their 50th Anniversary. While working at Dana he accepted a night teaching position in mathematics and engineering for the next ten years. Ed and Joanne developed a lifelong interest in camping. Later in life Ed and Joanne would both enjoy taking parents, grandchildren and friends on special camping trips. Ed's sons would recall "Dad preached hard work and dedication but also the necessity to take time and smell the roses." In 1977 Ed left Dana and opened a truck terminal for his father-in-law, Joe Bugyi. In 1984 Ed and Joanne started their own trucking company; Nagle Line Inc., eventually bringing all four sons into the family business. Ed and Joanne retired in 1997 and soon began spending winters in Haines City Florida where

a new chapter in his life would begin. Both Ed and Joanne became volunteers for Give Kids the World, an organization that brings comfort and assistance to children with life threatening illnesses. Ed and Joanne would greet many families with love and warmth. Ed would rarely speak of his efforts insisting that he was the student learning from so many brave young children, certainly lessons that were evident by Ed's bravery and humility he exhibited during this final year. Ed is survived by his wife Joanne, sister Carol Devine (Allan), sons: Ed III (Jane), Steve, Pat (Mickey), Mike (Lori). Grandchildren: E. Joseph IV (Jamie), Christie, Jeff, Stephanie McGill (Nick), Kelsy, Zack, William, Leanna and great granddaughter Penny Louise. Also surviving are sisters-in-law Elon Bugyi and Marlene Bankson, Niece Kris Sanders and family Nephew Bill Dressel and family.
