



Georgia Karousos

March 13, 1913 - January 14, 2010

Georgia Karousos, 96, died quietly in her daughter's home on January 14, 2010 under hospice care. Georgia was born March 13, 1913 in Milwaukee to Constantine and Panayota Kontoyiannis. At age 8, she moved to Greece when her mother died. A trained mid-wife nurse during World War II, she served in St. Andrews Hospital, Patras, a city heavily bombed by fascist forces. Her command of both English and Greek made her invaluable to the multi-national attending staff. During this time she met and married her husband, John, a member of the Greek underground. They married in 1946 and immigrated to Detroit where she found employment as a seamstress at J.L. Hudson Co. Georgia and John owned and operated the Acropolis Market and Bakery in Detroit until their retirement in 1974. She loved to cook, sew, garden, and laugh through the punch lines of jokes. Georgia was a member of the SS Constantine and Helen Greek Orthodox Church, Westland MI. and lately of Holy Trinity Greek Orthodox Cathedral of Toledo. Georgia is survived by her loving daughter, Persilla (Chris J.) Zervos, granddaughter Jackie Zervos, grandson Christopher (Patricia) Zervos, and great Granddaughters Kathryn and Abigail. She was preceded in death by her husband John in 2007.
