He loved his family so much that he carried pictures of everyone in his 3" thick

wallet. He had those vinyl photo sleeve strings and would unfurl it with the pride of a new parent every time he saw you as he pointed out each family member until arriving at your photo, then continuing to show off the rest of the family.

The world just got a little darker. RIP Greg.”
