Harry served in the United States Navy 1957-1959, as a machinist mate, boiler room operations aboard the USS McGowan DD678. Participated in the United States mission to protect and secure the Suez canal. A graduate from the Milwaukee School of Engineering with a degree in Metallurgy, he worked a majority of his life in the foundry industry starting at Wehr Steel in Milwaukee as supervisor of Metallurgy department. Harry began his sales career with the S. Obermeyer Co, then moved on to sales manager at C.E. Cast Industrial Products. In 1974 Harry started his own foundry called Piqua Castings in Piqua Ohio. He then returned to C.E. Cast as product manager. He went on to sales positions with Metallurgical Products, Inc., Core Lube, inc. and Riechold Chemicals. Harry then started and later retired from H & V Enterprises, inc. in Toledo. Harry's passion was in volunteering and helping others. A long time member of Epworth United Methodist Church and member of the Evangelism Committee & Administrative Council, Feed 5,000 and Mission and Community Outreach Committees. He was also a leader with the Salvation Army, Kairos prison ministry, Kairos Fourth Day Discussion group, Emmaus Walk of Northwest Ohio and Mountain Great Banquet of Toledo. Harry is survived by his wife Virginia, sons Jeffery S. Albright and his wife Patricia of Monroe, Brian Albright and his wife Olivia of Lambertville. Grandchildren Alexandria Albright, Jeffery C. Albright and Brandon Albright. Up to his illness prevented him from doing so, Harry loved attending all of the grandchildren's sports and school activities.
