James G. Rose, 74, of Toledo, died Tuesday January 5 at his home. He was born September 19, 1935 in Syracuse, NY, the only child of Gilbert J. and Vera M. (McLaughlin) Rose. His parents moved to Toledo during his youth. A graduate of Devilbiss High School, Jim attended the University of Toledo in the 1950's, where he was a member of Sigma Phi Epsilon. He was married June 15, 1957, to the former Beverly A. Kubitz. Jim worked more than 40 years for Key Bank, formerly Toledo Trust, retiring in December 1996. While working, he was active in, and was a past president, of his local chapter of the American Institute of Banking. In recent years he traveled extensively, visiting Ireland, Italy and England. He enjoyed Jazz music, flower gardening, watching woodland creatures in his backyard and attending live theater productions.
