



## Jane Ritter

March 23, 1927 - September 26, 2022

Jane Ritter, a teacher in the Washington Local School District for 28 years, passed away September 26, 2022, at Parkcliffe Memory Care Community. She was 95 years old.

Jane's first years of teaching were spent at Our Lady of Lourdes followed by teaching Special Education in the Washington Local School District. After 3 years in Special Education Jane was asked to teach Remedial Reading K-12. Jane ultimately became a supervisor in the reading department where her duties then consisted of writing and supervising developmental kindergarten programs and reading guides. She was also responsible for the curriculum, evaluations, and English as a second language. In her words "she loved every minute of it". After retirement Jane taught at Charter Behavior Hospital, the Hebrew Academy and volunteered at Regina Coeli Catholic School.

Preceding Jane in death was her husband of 72 years, George Ritter. Her sister, Jo Anne O'Neil and brother, Johnny also preceded Jane in death. George and Jane had a great life together and loved their children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren very much. Jane always said the best names ever were "Mom and Grandma." In retirement they traveled extensively visiting all 50 states along with Ireland, Spain, Canada, and Mexico.

Jane is survived by her daughter, Susan Fischbach, son Bill (Margi), six

grandchildren, 11 great grandchildren, niece, Judy (Dennis) Hill and cousin Ruth Long, as well as nieces and nephews.
