John Gary Loeb, 66 of Toledo, Ohio passed away suddenly on August 27, 2015. He was born to Charles (Boots) and Mildred Loeb on November 30, 1948. John, youngest of 4 boys, graduated from Thomas A. DeVilbiss high school in 1966. John proudly served his country in the U.S Army completing his tour of duty in Vietnam in 1971.

After returning home, John worked for the U.S. Postal Service but felt his true calling was to run his own company. Thus began John Loeb Painting, which he ran successfully for nearly 40 years, retiring in 2014. John took tremendous pride in his work and his attention to detail showed in the thousands of customer's homes he painted through the years. His "customer man" approach, coupled with his strong work ethic, proved quite successful. John was a beloved son, brother, uncle, great-uncle and friend to all who knew him. In addition to his parents, he is preceded in death by his brothers, Bill and Bob.
