Joseph John Patay, 82, passed away February 15, 2014, at Hospice of Northwest Ohio. He was born August 21, 1931, to Joseph and Elizabeth Patay in Toledo. He grew up in East Toledo, where he attended Holy Rosary School and Waite High School before graduating from Macomber.
