Joy Lee Lockert, 80, passed away Saturday January 21, 2012, at her home at Parkcliffe Community. Joy was born, March 3, 1931, in Flower Hospital and moved with her family for a brief time to Kentucky, where she attended boarding school. Returning to Toledo, she attended Whitney Vocational High School. Joy worked as an executive secretary at Owen-Illinois, and later served in the office of the First Alliance Church (formerly the Toledo Gospel Tabernacle). She and her husband Chuck provided homecare for their son Tim, and the three of them traveled extensively throughout the country, visiting 49 states.
