Joyce Meyer, age 90, passed away February 18, surrounded by her family. Joyce graduated with a teaching degree from Mary Grove College. She taught English and Journalism at Whitmer and Cardinal Stritch.

Joyce will be remembered for many things but primarily for her faith, family, and service. She met Paul on a blind date in 1949 and they later married and had eight children. She was a devout Catholic and parishioner at The Most Blessed Sacrament. She was an active member and past president of Heartbeat of Toledo, a pro-life organization.
