Judy Ridner, Toledo, OH, passed away unexpectedly on May 12, 2024. She was born to Clifford and Margarete (Welz) Reimund on February 15, 1944, in Napoleon, OH. Growing up on a farm and the oldest of three sisters, she learned to be productive and self-sufficient at an early age. She graduated from Napoleon High School in 1962. She worked at the Northwest Signal as society editor until she followed in her mother's footsteps and completed nurses training at the Toledo Hospital. Upon graduation in 1965 she married Roy Ridner and continued to work at the Toledo Hospital until 1999 when they fulfilled their dream of moving to Las Vegas. During the years in between, Judy raised their daughter Renee and son Robert. Summers and free time were spent at their cottage in Manitou Beach, MI on Round Lake.

She completed requirements for a BS in Health Education degree from the University of Toledo in 1990. She was preceded in death by her husband, Roy in 2000. Judy continued to live an active and happy life in Henderson, NV.

She served her Henderson community as a COPS volunteer and enjoyed being a member of the Red Hat Society, attending Broadway productions at the Smith Center, card making, and splash and laugh at the community pool. She was the snackmaster on her road trips with her sister, Pat and brother-in-law, John. They traveled to all four corners of the US including Alaska and Hawaii. One of her favorite trips was to the Canadian Rockies. She recently

moved back to Toledo and enjoyed re-connecting with old friends and spending more time with family as well as becoming an active member of the Ohio Living Swan Creek community.

Judy is survived by her daughter, Renee Trout (Mike Rombach); son, Robert Ridner (Anita); sisters, Pat Stewart (John), Mary Ellen Reimund; grandsons, Evan Trout, Tyler Trout, and Riley Ridner; as well as nephews and nieces.
