June Kosolka, age 68, passed away on Wednesday, October 5, 2016 at Regency Hospital following a courageous battle from bypass surgery on August 24. She was born on December 19, 1947, in Toledo, Ohio, to Frank John and Cecilia (Pomorski) Kosolka.

June battled many severe illnesses for a very long time, including Sarcoidosis, accepted them, never complained and fought them so bravely to the end. A
