Kathleen A. Fesh was born June 30th, 1939 in Elmira, New York to Joseph and Susan Sullivan. She died peacefully, at the age of 83, on July 21st, 2022, at Hospice of NW Ohio. She was a graduate of Notre Dame Academy in Elmira, New York, and had dreams of becoming a nurse, but life (also known as Mike) had different plans for her. She married Michael J. Fesh in 1958. She and her husband eventually moved to Toledo with three of their four children, and completed their family with their fourth child, while residing here. She held many professional positions throughout her life, but raising her children was always her greatest accomplishment. She was the epitome of a MOTHER—being her children’s moral compass throughout their lives.

She was a proud member of St. Agnes Parish for many years, later becoming a member of St. Joseph Catholic Church in Sylvania. Later in life, she looked forward to having breakfast with her church group every Saturday morning and attending mass with her friends and family. You could always find her at a sporting event, cheering on her family, and taking so much joy in capturing everything on film. She also loved spending time at home with all her family over for dinner. The kids especially loved her Italian meals, which she learned from her in-laws in

New York. She had an affinity for classical music, and all things Christmas. Anytime you stopped by to say hello to her, you could almost guarantee she was watching a tennis match. She was affectionately known as “Bubbles” by her grand and great grandchildren.
