A graduate of Waite High School, Ken honorably served his country as a Staff Sergeant in the Army Air Corps during World War II. In 1945 he married Anna Folger, who preceded him in death in 2001. Ken worked in the sales department of Libbey-Owens-Ford for 44 years before retiring in 1983 as a District Sales Manager. He maintained a keen interest in his customers and in the glass industry even after his retirement. Ken enjoyed golf and played well into his 80's. He scored three holes-in-one, including one during a University of Toledo sponsored hole-in-one contest. A lifelong baseball fan, Ken was an avid supporter of his beloved Chicago Cubs. He enjoyed reading the newspaper and working the crossword puzzle. He was a member of the Toledo Post of the American Legion. Ken will be deeply missed by his children, Louise (Michael) Ehrick, Kenneth Jr. (Barbara), Jane, and Alan (Sandy).
