Loma J. Cole, age 90, of Toledo, Ohio, passed away November 25, 2008 at Sunset House. She was born on July 9, 1918 to Ernest and Clara (Bulach) Cole in Toledo, Ohio. Loma graduated from St. Ursula Academy in 1936. She attended Bay City Jr. College, Mary Manse College, and DePaul University. She became the Medical Records Director when St. Charles Hospital opened in 1953. Loma retired after 28 years of service. After retirement, she continued to give generously to St. Charles by monthly deductions from her pension and pledges for new programs such as a new Pediatric Center. Loma was a member of the Zonta Club, made deliveries for Mobile Meals, and was active in many community activities. She was notoriously late for family functions because she was either working late or helping friends. She took in a stray dog "Buddy" who was her constant companion for many years. She was a kind and loving person who thought of others, not herself. Loma was preceded in death by her parents, brother, George "Bud" Cole, and great-nephew Matthew. She is survived by nephews Daniel (Cheryl) and Richard Cole, and niece Diane. She has a great-niece Christi and three great-nephews, Scott, Jeffrey, and Michael. She has a great-great niece Mira and great-great nephew Logan. The family is planning a private service and burial.
