He was an avid builder of models and dioramas and was an enthusiastic gardener. He and Esther enjoyed many happy hours together in their yard. Lyhnn will best be remembered for his dry, irreverent wit and highly infectious laugh. He leaves behind his loving wife of 35 years, Esther (Cousino) Keeling, sisters and brothers-in-laws and many friends.
