“ Dear Don and Linda, Please accept our sincere condolences on the passing of your mom on June 18. My family was your next door neighbor in the early sixties when we both lived on Sandra Drive. We lived in the home at 5137. In my recollection you were both pre-teens at that time, although you Don, may have been a teen. We had a little boy named Greg when we moved in there and his brother Gary was born while we lived there. I got a job with Owens Corning late in 1961 and we moved to Newark shortly thereafter. Greg had just turned 3 and Gary was 1. Your father was a very patient, helpful and highly respected guy. We interfaced at least a dozen times during my 12 years at OC. When he passed in 1995 I wrote your mom a note and she responded with a very pleasant and thankful response. We agreed to correspond from time to time but that unfortunately did not happen. In 1963 I was transferred to a new plant site in Waxahachie Texas (on I-35E south of Dallas) as part of a team that built, started up and operated that facility. I recall your Dad visiting there at least one time. We had two daughters, Gina and Gayle born in Waxahachie in 1964 and 1967 respectively. I served at one other location for OC before being transferred to Toledo in 1970. It was there that I worked with your father on a number of things. I left OC late in 1973 and moved to Defiance, Ohio where I co-founded Koester Metals, Inc. ([www.kmienclosures.com](http://www.kmienclosures.com)) in 1975. I bought out my partner a few years later and completed a sale of the company to my son Gary in 1996. He operates it today. We now live in retirement in FL not far from Orlando. I'll always remember your nice family as neighbors for a few years and the infrequent but memorable contacts I subsequently had with both your mother and father. Our prayers are with you.
