August 28, 1931 - July 8, 2024

Nancy Louise Einhart died peacefully on Sunday, July 8th at the age of 92 at Toledo Hospital, surrounded by her family.

A lifelong Toledo resident, she was born on August 28, 1931, to Earl and Eleanor Denman. She graduated from Scott High School in 1949 where she met her future husband, James. They were married at Collingwood Methodist Church on August 25, 1951.

Nancy loved to entertain and she and her husband hosted many pool parties at their home on Hazelhurst Avenue. Nancy and Jim discovered a love of ballroom dancing at Billyle Supper Club and Centennial Terrace with friends and family.

She was employed by Toledo Hospital in Medical Records for 18 years, retiring in 1988. She had been a resident at Oakleaf Village in Sylvania for the past three years and was beloved by both friends and staff.

She was preceded in death by her parents, sister Jane Smith, and husband Jim. She is survived by her four daughters; Pattye Nicolls (Bill), Janet, Jackie VanTress (Mark), and Jane Rude (John), seven grandchildren, and 12 great-grandchildren.
