Ron supported the AAU Golden Gloves Boxing Program serving as a Match Judge. He was a proud backer of Whitmer High School athletics. After retirement, Mr. Eaton enjoyed woodworking where he utilized his immense talents to bestow his children with now priceless keepsakes.
