Roula Manton, 83 passed away in her home surrounded by loved ones. It was her greatest wish to remain in her home and that wish was fulfilled. She was a spitfire, a vibrant human being with a zest for life. Roula was born in Thessaloniki, Greece to Stephanos and Kalliopi (Binietoglu) Lazaridis. She grew up in the aftermath of WWII. This event formed much of her appreciation for life, her desire for social justice and empathy for people. During her youth she was involved in girl scouts, where she was a participant and a counselor. She was involved in civic work projects volunteering her time. She graduated from Aristotelian University Law School. She arrived in the United States and became a naturalized citizen in 1965. She was very proud of becoming a US citizen. She was an interpreter and translator for people who needed help with legal documents. She became a Greek school teacher and director. She taught English for Toledo Public Schools, to students newly arrived in Toledo. She made a leap into real estate and earned her license in 1976 and worked as a realtor until her retirement in 2015. She loved real estate, finding homes for individuals and families. Many of her clients were repeat customers and in the end friends. She was recognized for her achievements in real estate, as a million-dollar producer.

She was a devoted member of Holy Trinity Greek Orthodox Cathedral. She was a Sunday school teacher, a youth group advisor chaperoning many events. She was a long-time member of Philoptochos, served on parish

council, was president of Philoptochos and a yearly volunteer at the Greek American Festival. She was involved in the International Institute of Greater Toledo, where she was honored with a distinguished service award. She was an excellent baker, distributing Greek pastries every holiday season to her clients. She loved to cook as well creating delicious dishes with whatever ingredients she had at hand. She was a prodigious knitter creating beautiful sweaters and scarves, and she had a passion for flowers. She loved her garden and spent countless hours outside tending to her blooms. She is survived by her daughter, Phyllis and son, Stephen; sister, Niki Argyroudi; brother, Charalambos; sister-in-law, Mairi Lazaridis of Thessaloniki, Greece, along with cousins, nieces, and nephews.
