Susan K. Wiseman, 55, of Toledo, passed away Sunday, July 29, 2007, in St. Joseph Hospital, Bellingham, WA, while vacationing in Alaska. She was born September 21, 1951, in Toledo and was the daughter of Marvin and Mildred Gibson. Sue was a 1969 graduate of Whitmer High School, a 1972 graduate of Indiana University and received her Masters Degree in music from Ball State, in 1974. She was a member of Monroe Street United Methodist Church, the Wesleyan Chorus, Shoreland Parent Club, Northwest Buckeye Council of Better Investing and the Ohio Music Education Association. Sue was the conductor of the Junior Youth Orchestra, in Toledo. She taught at DeVilbiss High School, Deveaux Junior High and was also the band director at DeVilbiss High School, until it closed. Survivors include her husband of 32 years, William H. Wiseman; sons, Jay (Trena) Wiseman and Michael Wiseman; granddaughters, Trena, Carrina, and Evangelina Wiseman. Sue was preceded in death by her son, Todd Wiseman and her parents.
