Verna Viola Sloan, 88, of Sylvania, Ohio passed away Saturday, December 11th, at Charter Senior Living of Oak Openings. She was born in Martin, Ohio on October 1st, 1933, to August and Emma Klingbeil. She graduated from Harris-Elmore High School in 1951, and the Toledo Hospital School of Nursing in 1954.
