William Louis Wicks of Blissfield, Michigan, died peacefully in his home on Friday, April 25, 2008. He was born on May 11, 1922, to Louis and Edna Wicks in Trenton, New Jersey, but spent most of his younger years in Wilmington, Delaware. Bill served in the U. S. Army during World War II assigned to the 198th Coast Guard Artillery, B Battery. He fought the German troops in Panama, and the Japanese forces in the South Pacific. Following the service, Bill worked as a boilermaker with Local 85 in Rossford for many years. He had a life long interest in aviation, and even built his own plane. In addition to building things, Bill loved to travel and visited every state except Hawaii. One of his favorite spots was Gettysburg, Virginia, since he loved studying the civil war. Bill and his wife, Madelyn, who predeceased him, resided in Sylvania for many years, and then moved to a mountain home in Colorado which he built for retirement. More recently he was living in Blissfield to be closer to his daughter, Sandra Susie Dacey , who survives him. Also surviving is his sister, Suzanne Sellers, from Texas, and his granddaughter, Teresa Dacey of Temperance. Bill had two brothers—Boyd and Bob—who preceded him in death. Friends are invited to visit from 11 a.m. until the time of service at 1 p.m. Monday in the Ansberg-West Funeral Home, 3000 Sylvania Avenue. Reverend Robert L. Wuellner will officiate. Interment will be in Toledo Memorial Park.
