



## William Scott Fry

September 15, 1945 - June 19, 2022

On Sunday, June 19, 2022, William Scott Fry, loving husband and father of two children, passed away at the age of 76. Scott was born on September 15, 1945 in Williamsport, PA to William M. Fry and Betty A. Fry (Hutchinson).

As a kid growing up in Williamsport—home of the Little League World Series—Scott developed an early love for baseball. He was a gifted ballplayer who enjoyed playing the game alongside his childhood best friend, John English. As an adult, Scott loved his family and his work, and he devoted himself to both, wholeheartedly. Throughout his life, he was the patriarch, the protector, and the guiding light for family members across generations. A prominent figure here in Toledo, he built an impressive career in healthcare administration, punctuated by a 37-year run as President and CEO of the Hospital Council of Northwest Ohio.

Scott is survived by his wife of 38 years, Barbara Fry; daughter, Emily Fry; son, Matthew Fry; brother, Richard Hutchinson, and former spouse, Kathleen Murphy.

A visitation will be held on Thursday, June 23, 2022, 1-8 p.m., which includes a 7 p.m. prayer service, at Ansberg-West Funeral Home, 3000 W. Sylvania Ave., Toledo, OH.
